## **Chamber Gets Jazzed**

The Colorado Springs Chamber Music Society will present a free program Wednesday designed to prove that chamber music is not isolated to the 15th century.

The society will perform for the public at 8 p.m. in the Assembly Theatre of the First United Methodist Church, 420 N. Nevada Ave.

The program will include a variety of pieces ranging from "old favorites" to contemporary jazz.
